


Even the G20 Leaders have their doubts

"We are deeply concerned about rising instances of protectionism around the world."









Who is responsible for G20 protectionism?




Types of beggar thy neighbour measure used




G20 Circumvention of the WTO



So much crisis-era protectionism needs to be unwound






■ Next 10 average ■ G20 average

Crisis-era harm done to Swiss commercial interests




- Before the Los Cabos G20 summit in 2012, 317 measures harmed Swiss commercial interests. Only 20% have been unwound.
- Since Los Cabos, 56 more hits to Swiss interests have occurred and 2 unwound.
- 52% of Swiss exports faces a subsidised competitor in foreign markets.



Harm to Chinese interests



- Interests hit the most of any nation since crisis began.
- Harmed 1083 times.
- Only 131 unwound.
- G20 members responsible for 776 hits.
