MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE FEDERAL DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC AFFAIRS OF THE SWISS CONFEDERATION AND THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE OF THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA ON LAUNCHING THE NEGOTIATIONS FOR A SWITZERLAND-CHINA FREE TRADE AGREEMENT

The Federal Department of Economic Affairs of the Swiss Confederation and the Ministry of Commerce of the People's Republic of China ("the Parties"):

RECOGNIZING the long standing friendship and strong economic and political ties between the Swiss Confederation and the People's Republic of China;

RESOLVED to deepen and strengthen these links and aiming at developing and enhancing their economic and trade relations;

BUILDING on their mutual commitment to the World Trade Organization (WTO) and determined to contribute to the harmonious development and expansion of world trade;

RECOGNIZING the complementarities of the economies of Switzerland and China, and the potential for enhanced trade and investment flows as well as for closer economic exchange and cooperation between them;

RECALLING their intention to establish a framework for the intensification, expansion and diversification of the trade and investment flows between Switzerland and China:

RECALLING the recognition of China's full market economy status by the Swiss Government in 2007; and

RECALLING the Memorandum of Understanding signed in Beijing on 13 August 2010 endorsing the conclusions and recommendations contained in the report of the Joint Swiss-Chinese Study Group and announcing that negotiations on a Switzerland-China Free Trade Agreement would be opened in the near future, once the necessary internal procedures on both sides have been accomplished;
